Having begun with one musician running a small project in the council's carehomes, we became a registered charity in 2016, and have grown to a team of 4 musicians, supported by around 20 volunteers and a fabulous board of skilled and pro-active trustees. We now work with at least 300 beneficiaries a year in care-homes, sheltered housing schemes, community centres and GP surgeries across York, and run around 50 intergenerational events and projects annually with hundreds of children and young people from York's schools, universities and the sixth form college. All of this is most definitely worth celebrating, and we are very much looking forward to our anniversary concert at the National Centre for Early Music on Friday 22nd March 7-9pm. There will be around 60 performers from our groups and choirs (pictured here in rehearsals!) singing alongside Fulford School choir – it will be an evening of joyous intergenerational celebration, so please join us if you can.
