Fulford School choir set the tone for the evening with a delightful performance, closely followed by our one and only George Dodd from Glen Lodge Independent Living Community who has taken the microphone for us on many occasions over the years, and sang his long-time favourite, The White Cliffs of Dover. George and the children were joined by David from our group at Barstow House to deliver a lively rendition of When You're Smiling, and our newest group, York Medical Group's 'Acomb Singers' showed no sign of nerves when they took to the stage for their first ever performance!

Singers and guitar players from Barstow House got the audience involved with a brilliant performance of George Ezra's 'Shotgun', and our amazing community choir, which now numbers over 50 members, left people open-mouthed with their incredible performance. The finale was an absolute show-stopper, with all our performers taking to the stage to wow the audience with a 4-part version of Amazing Grace, The Rhythm of Life and Ain't No Mountain High Enough (with actions for the audience!).

A final word should go to our fabulous soloists: 15-year old Rose Beckett, who took to the stage with 92 year old Beattie Hall, to sing Beattie's favourite song, You Raise Me Up – a wonderfully confident and moving performance; and Margaret Jenkins from Ebor Court care-home, who sang Moon River like an angel.
